## **Survey Results!**


I received a lot of great feedback and ideas from survey-takers. Not all ideas will appear in the 2022 calendar but some of them might appear in future editions.


Surprisingly, the majority of respondents had no preference on photo subjects (39%) or preferred seeing people have fun at events (29%)

In my survey from five years ago, the reason people bought the calendar was split even between photos and things to do. But this time around the "things to do" won out with a whopping 97% of the votes.


Thank you to whomever did that last write in vote. :)

Similar to the photos, respondents wanted content that was overwhelmingly "stuff I'm not familiar with" (68%).


I often think of the calendar of a reminder to do the things I already know about but apparently respondents have a far better memory than me.
